1. Black-necked Stilt L
Bright pink legs, Black upperparts



2. American Avocet L
Black and white winged, in summer has orange head and neck



3. Killdeer M
Two black breast bands, red eye ring



4. Semipalmated Plover S
One black breast band, bicolored bill



5. Spotted Sandpiper S
Tail-bobbing behavior, upperparts
highly spotted in summer



6. Black-bellied Plover M
Black wingpits visible in flight



7. Dunlin S
Slightly drooping bill



8. Greater Yellowlegs L
Yellow legs, long bill, call is typically three notes



9. Lesser Yellowlegs M
Yellow legs, straight bill, call is typically
two notes





10. Long-billed Curlew L Very long, down-curved bill, warm cinnamon colored underparts



11. Western Sandpiper S

Very small size, black legs



12. Snowy Plover S Small black bill, grayish legs



13. Marbled Godwit L
Long, bicolored, slightly upturned bill



14. Willet L
White wing stripe and black outer wing visible in flight



15. Long-billed Dowitcher M
Long and straight bill, feeds with 'sewing-machine' type motion, white patch on back visible in flight



16. Wilson's Phalarope SDainty, grey upperparts, often feeds by spinning in circles in deeper water



17. Red-necked Phalarope S
Very small size, thin bill, often feeds by spinning in circles in deeper water



18. Least Sandpiper S
Very small size, yellowish legs
